# Gideon: the turning point

- Gideon stands against idolatry 6:1-32
- Gideon fights against Israel's enemies 6:33-7:25
- Gideon fights against Israel 8:1-21
- Gideon commits idolatry 8:22-32

This is where we see the rejection of Yahweh as king and the establishment of a human king

### Gideon: hesitant but faithful 6:1-32

- The call of Gideon
  - Gideon lacks understanding, why? Parenting!
  - Exodus narrative revisited (Moses' story)
  - Asking for a sign
- Baal destroyed
  - Obedient but cowardly
  - "Dad" steps in

# Gideon: the worrying warrior 6:33-7:25

- The Midianite threat
- Fleece
  - $\circ \qquad \text{Asking for a sign} \dots \text{ again}$
  - Concrete security in things we can control
- Yahweh getting the glory
  - Thinning the troops
  - A God-given sign
  - Yahweh delivers

### Practical Application: why we fail

- We don't take time to trust God at his word
- We are just like Gideon: ignorant
  - We don't know our christian heritage
  - We don't know the scriptures
  - We act with hesitation and cowardice at God's commands
  - We want signs and wonders more than his word
- Overall, we don't have a good working understanding of God

# What we learned

- Gideon starts right, but is shaky
  - Cowardice in removing idols
  - Hesitation in fighting Midian
- Setup for Gideon putting trust in concrete securities he can control instead of Yahweh
